business opportunities arising from the Belt and Road Initiative.

The ninth edition in 2024 gathered over **6,000 participants from 76 countries** and regions, featured **97 heavyweight speakers**, and facilitated over **800 one-to-one business matching meetings** involving more than **290 projects**. These impressive outcomes reaffirm the Summit's status as a premier platform for Belt and Road collaboration and showcase the keen global interest in Belt and Road

2024 Summit Audience Highlight The 2024 Summit gathered over 6,000 participants from 76 countries and regions.

Dealmaking and Project Investment Sessions The Deal-making Session offered a platform for deal-sourcing meetings for project owners, investors, high net-worth individuals, and senior professionals from intermediaries, family offices and professional service providers. The deal-making session had been extended to a total of 4 days, with 2-day on-site meetings (11-12 Sept) and 2 days online extension on 16-17 Sept 2024.

Under the themes of "Innovation and Technology", "Transport and Logistics Infrastructure", "Energy, Natural Resources & Public Utilities", "Urban Development" and "Innovation and Technology", as well as a new session addressing project opportunities in the Middle East and North Africa, project owners from around the world showcased their project ventures in the thematic Project Investment Sessions. Through one-to-one business matching meetings, Summit participants met with potential business partners based on their shared areas of

interest through pre-arranged meetings. The 2024 Summit showcased more than **290** investment projects and arranged over **800** one-to-one business matching meetings for project owners, investors and services providers.
